


# Club Strategy

This collaborative effort in creating and enjoying these activities builds a wonderful culture at our club. I am proud of our continued efforts to improve facilities for members, and of the social and family focus we prioritise, as well as the achievements of our high-performance players. We are inclusive and visitors always comment on our manaakitanga. I am proud of the Island ay tennis whanau.

Tennis Central and Tennis New Zealand are keen to keep people in our communities in Tennis. It is a wonderful game to enjoy with friends and family throughout our lives. In the coming year we aim to promote our club further in our community and to invite potential members to come and see what our club has to offer.

### Tennis Central Awards

We were very proud to have David Knight as a finalist in the 'Club Coach of the year' and 'Performance Coach of the year' category and our Club nominated for 'Club of the Year' at the Annual Tennis Central Awards in August this year. Our Technifibre Mixed Interclub team gained the C-Grade award and our Premier Men's 2 team gained promotion to Premier 1 next season. This is an amazing achievement and is testament to the commitment of the players in this team. Tennis in our region continues to be 'on the up' and we enjoyed celebrating in the successes of many players, clubs, coaches and volunteers at these awards.

### Coaching

Led by David Knight and his team, the club has continued to provide excellent coaching options for a range of playing abilities.

Rusty and Rusty-ish; on Monday evenings and Active Tennis on Thursday evenings before Club Night and also on Friday mornings. Senior players have also benefitted from training camps. We had an excellent camp run by Paul and Alice in April which focussed on volleying. Juniors have also been involved in individual and group coaching sessions and it is fantastic to see the progress they make, and their confidence build to try interclub. Friday afternoon Junior Club Days have also been popular this year with a number of new families taking part.

Hopefully this will extend to children and families visiting our club in September for 'Love Tennis 2023'.

While we did not take part in the parade in the Island Bay Festival in February, we did invite the public and members of the Island Bay Community to our club over the Island Bay Festival weekend. We had several current members attend and welcome visitors. We also promoted a membership deal and had several people join our club because of this.

We donated a Tennis membership to the Island Bay School Silent Auction fundraiser and hope to be involved in other community events in the coming year.



### Love Tennis Weekend 2022

Our annual 'Love Tennis' weekend was a huge success! We had an amazing team of volunteers who



baked, made Supreme coffee, and interacted with visitors in the clubrooms and on court. We also had David and Alice running some awesome on-court activities and hitting drills and Andy, Magnus and others having fun hitting with many visitors, both young and old.

The theme for the day was 'Under the Sea' given our proximity to Island Bay. We had a bubble machine, 'guess how many balls in the basket' game, face-painting, a disco on court and more! Our social media guru, Kristen, documented the day in 'real time' and made sure we had music to add to the atmosphere. Thank-you to existing members who came along to help with this event and who interacted with members of the community in a friendly way.

Thank-you also to Supreme Coffee for supporting this event. We also thank Mel Jansen and Flo Perret from Tennis Central who provide advice, merchandise and advertising for the 'Love Tennis' event. Tennis Central do an amazing job promoting Tennis in our region and we really appreciate their energy, enthusiasm and support in helping us in many ways throughout the season.

The growth of our club is vital to its sustainability. Love Tennis is a great opportunity to showcase our club and to encourage people to develop a love for the game as we all have! I hope many of you will be



able to come along to this event coming up in September and help promote our club and our sport to potential new members.

#### Social Slams and Parent-Child Tournaments



A focus for me has been finding ways to get members involved in club tournaments that do not cost them anything. This is a chance for players to come along to organised events and have fun!

We have continued to organize a monthly Social Slam on a Sunday afternoon. These have taken place from 2-4:30pm on a Sunday, either at our courts or at the Renouf Tennis Centre. The primary goal of each Social Slam is to get Senior members of all abilities participating in a fun tournament. It is an afternoon of short mixed doubles matches, with players rotating each match. We encourage new members to join us at these events as they are a great way to meet other members at the club. We finish the afternoon with a shared afternoon tea and a drink, and members enjoy this too.

We have run one Parent-Child Tournament so far this year and have another one scheduled for September. I really enjoy seeing families of young and older children on court. Tennis is a fantastic family game, and we hope to see many of you on court at our next Parent-Child Tournament soon.

### Tennis Projects

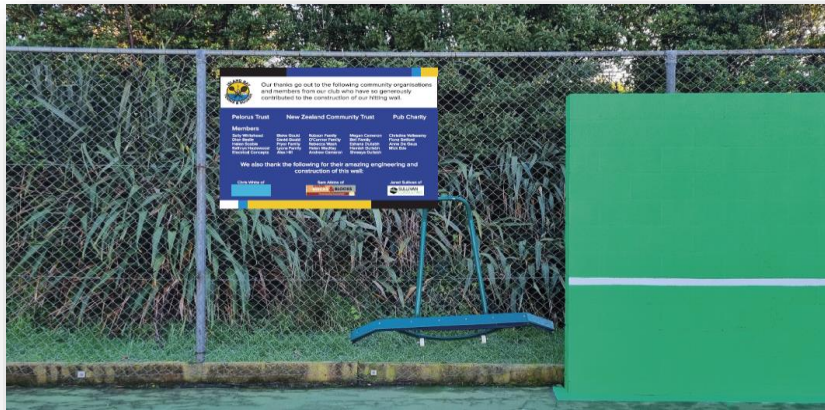

The event received valuable local support from division sponsors and contributors. Both played their best squash in the teams' competition where they were able to showcase their talent and passion for the sport. Cheryl Sullivan and Evan Michelson were also selected for the 2022 Wellington Masters Rep team and competed in the National Masters in Hamilton. These honours were a testament to their hard work and dedication.

### Milestones/Achievements

The club celebrated numerous individual, team and club milestone

Most of these were players achieving and surpassing milestone grades, whether it was Rob McDonald going from D grade all the way to C1 or Anna Marquis-Skepetaris making it back to B1 after a long hiatus. We also defended our Best Social Media title at the District Awards on the back of our entertaining and engaging Island Bay Squash Facebook group.

Our top 'Summer Masters' team got the 2023 season off to a great start by winning division 1 with a great victory in the final, showcasing the club's talent for the more experienced player.

Unfortunately, this most recent winter interclub season wasn't as successful, but we did have 3 teams make the finals once again and one of the teams, our Hot Madrases, went on to win its final away from home.

### Tournaments

Island Bay players attended various tournaments locally and out of district, achieving success and bonding with each other. We are great tourists and love catching up with ex-members. This year our trips included Tauranga, now home to Nick Lowther and Tim Cen and Blenheim, expertly hosted by John Michalskis. During summer and the pre-season, it was our turn to host the Surf City v Island Bay Club Challenge, the Ashes of New Zealand squash. Unfortunately, Surf City managed to defend its unique lifebuoy trophy. The event was a great success again for both clubs especially off court, thanks to the contributions of many players and the strong Te Rāwhiti connection in our club.

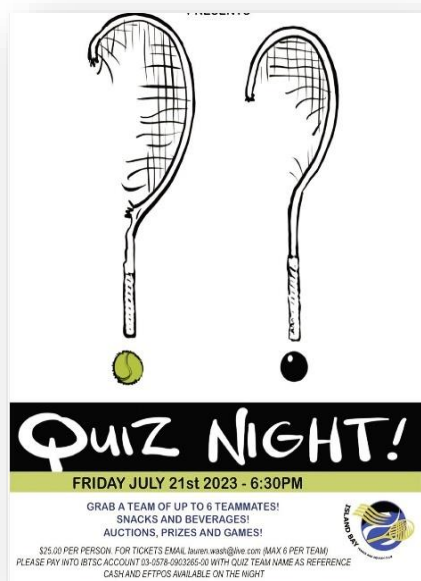

# Infrastructure & Maintenance

*Gerard Elkink, Committee Chairperson*

The past year has been a period of completing previously started projects, continuing work for ongoing projects, and maintaining what we already have. Whilst not very exciting to look at the results of this work nevertheless represent a lot of effort on the part of the people looking after them and these people deserve our sincere thanks.

Provision of lighting for the tennis courts is our biggest project at the moment and has taken many hours of work by Phil, Charlotte and the rest of the Lights Committee, to coordinate design work, meetings with Wellington City Council for planning permission and of course, fundraising. The work is still going on, but progress is steady.

The tennis hitting wall was completed in April 2023.

Work to resurface the observation deck was begun earlier this year by people from BNU as part of their agreement to assist with maintenance. The area was water-blasted in preparation for the application of traffic guard, but this did reveal a few areas of concern round the windows where water seems to be entering and causing the underlying wood to rot. This will need some attention so that the membrane will last longer than a few years. There are also a few places where holes could start due to deck fastening starting to push up through the existing membrane. More investigation is required. Note that we will be liable if water starts to leak into the Services Club area.

There have been some problems with the galvanised iron building roof leaking water into the women's changing area. We have had various people looking at possible solutions. One of these was to replace the entire roof, at considerable cost, but it seems that we may be able to get by with a repair. Work on this is continuing.

As a sign of the times, our internet connection which links the bar Eftpos system to the world, was moved from copper to fibre after a last-minute communication from Chorus telling us that they would no longer support the old technology.

A topic that came up for discussion recently was that of hiring companies to do various jobs round the club that in the past would have been done by volunteers as part of a working bee. This is something that will need to be addressed in the future as members find themselves less able to assist directly due to time and skill constraints. The main issue is the money to fund the work, and how to get it.

In conclusion, thanks to all Committee and club members (and those helpers that are neither) who put in so much hard work in ensuring that our facilities remain in good condition.



# Bar and Social

The bar continues to be able to provide a diverse range of choices to members and visitors to the club; thanks to strong patronage from club members, visitors and BNU. If you're looking for a venue to host a private event, remember that the club is an option. Just reach out to me if you wish to make any enquiries.

The club is currently investigating the use of Paywave at the club. There are also still upgrades that the bar needs with a new fridge and glass washer the highest priorities. We have recently installed a pc at the club which can be used to play Spotify. Please let me know if you have questions about using it – but I ask that members not install other programs/use it for other purposes. If it is misused, then it'll get removed or turned into a kiosk (like the Helloclub computer downstairs which only has a singular purpose).
